## Call No Man Father?

- Matthew 23: [9] And call no man your father on earth, for you have one Father, who is in heaven...
  - Did Jesus really mean we can NOT call any man Father?
    - Don't we call our Priest's Father? Is this Unbiblical?
    - What about our own Fathers?
    - About about Rabbis / Teachers? Are we NOT to call any body teachers either?
    - Didn't he also say in Luke 18:

- [18] And a ruler asked him, "Good Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?" [19] And Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone.
  - Notice he didn't rebuke him for the "teacher" bit?
  - Are we NOT to call anyone "good" though?

- So what did he mean? & Why do we call our Priest's Father?
  - For starters... Did Jesus FORBIT calling anyone "Father" other than God the Father?
    - NO!
  - What about:
    - Jesus calling Abraham Father? John 8:
      [56] Your father Abraham rejoiced that he was to see my day; he saw it and was glad."
    - St. Stephan Also called the Pharisees & Patriarch's Father: Acts 7:2] And Stephen said: "Brethren and fathers, hear me. The God of glory appeared to our father Abraham, when he was in Mesopota'mia, before he lived in Haran,
    - St. Paul Calls himself a Father of Timothy: Philippians 2:[22] But Timothy's worth you know, how as a son with a father he has served with me in the gospel.

- Also of Onesimus: Philemon [10] I appeal to you for my child, Ones'imus, whose father I have become in my imprisonment.
- St. John also referees to the "elders" as Father's: 1 John 2:[13] I am writing to you, fathers, because you know him who is from the beginning. I am writing to you, young men, because you have overcome the evil one. I write to you, children, because you know the Father.
  [14] I write to you, fathers, because you know him who is from the beginning. I write to you, young men, because you are strong, and the word of God abides in you, and you have overcome the evil one.
- What About St. Peter? He referred to Mark as his son: 1 Peter 5:13

- The role of Priest as Father!
  - Dr. Scott Hahn from "Many Are Called"
    - Adam was Priest, & Father of the Human Race!
      - Pg. 44 "After Adam's failure..."
      - Pg. 46 "Never the less, in the book of Judges..."
- In the NEW Covenant we have a NEW Priesthood
  - 12 NEW Princes set up with the "Blood of the Covenant" to offer sacrifices for the people! **Ex**

- Washing their feet like Moses was commanded to do for Aaron & his SONS Lev. 8
- BUT... What about St. Peter? A NEW Chief Steward?
  - we see his roll as the NEW Prime Minister of the Kingdom, Matthew 16, through the lens of the OLD Prim Minister...
    - Isaiah 22:
    - [15] Thus says the Lord GOD of hosts,
      "Come, go to this steward, to Shebna, who is over the household, and say to him:
      - [16] What have you to do here and whom have you here, that you have hewn here a tomb for yourself, you who hew a tomb on the height, and carve a habitation for yourself in the rock?
      - [17] Behold, the LORD will hurl you away violently, O you strong man. He will seize firm hold on you,
      - [18] and whirl you round and round, and throw you like a ball into a wide land; there you shall die, and there shall be your splendid chariots, you shame of your master's house.
      - [19] I will thrust you from your office, and you will be cast down from your station.

- [20] In that day I will call my servant Eli'akim the son of Hilki'ah,
- [21] and I will clothe him with your robe, and will bind your girdle on him, and will commit your authority to his hand; and he shall be a *father* to the inhabitants of Jerusalem and to the house of Judah.
- [22] And I will place on his shoulder the key of the house of David; he shall open, and none shall shut; and he shall shut, and none shall open.
- [23] And I will fasten him like a peg in a sure place, and he will become a throne of honor to his father's house.
- [24] And they will hang on him the whole weight of his father's house, the offspring and issue, every small vessel, from the cups to all the flagons.
- [25] In that day, says the LORD of hosts, the peg that was fastened in a sure place will give way; and it will be cut down and fall, and the burden that was upon it will be cut off, for the LORD has spoken."
- So... did Jesus not understand what HE himself meant in Matthew 23? Or what about HIS disciples?

- OR....

- Maybe he was NOT speaking LITERALLY but, rather figuratively?
  - Trying to communicate to us that God is the REAL deal... everything down here is a mere shadow of the reality!
  - IF we, as FATHER's are NOT leading our CHILDREN to the TRUE Father... then we are certainly NOT Father's but, rather... stumbling blocks!
  - Like Adam, who is created to be both Priest & Father... leading his offspring to God...
    - So are the Priests, of the Church of the Lamb... called to sacrifice & lead the spiritual offspring to God!
