 - o In the "cool of the day" while in captivity in Babylon...
 - Daniel faced Jerusalem
 - Offering prayers... confessing his sins and the sins of the people of God....
 - At the hour of incense 3 pm one of the Burning one's (Highest of Seraphim)... the Archangel Gabriel came to proclaim a WORD from God for the future redeemer of the people of God.
 - 490 years are decreed... (70 x 7 how much do you forgive? Mt. 18:21-22) for the redemption and a NEW Temple!!!
 - Daniel 9:20-27 (RSVCE) 20 While I was speaking and praying, confessing my sin and the sin of my people Israel, and presenting my supplication before the Lord my God for the holy hill of my God; 21 while I was speaking in prayer, the man Gabriel, whom I had seen in the vision at the first, came to me in swift flight at the time of the evening sacrifice. 22 He came and he said to me. "O Daniel, I have now come out to give you wisdom and understanding. 23 At the beginning of your supplications a word went forth, and I have come to tell it to you, for you are greatly beloved; therefore consider the word and understand the vision. 24 "Seventy weeks of years are decreed concerning your people and your holy city, to finish the transgression, to put an end to sin, and to atone for iniquity, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal both vision and prophet, and to anoint a most holy place. 25 Know therefore and understand that from the going forth of the word to restore and build Jerusalem to the coming of an anointed one, a prince, there shall be seven weeks. Then for sixty-two weeks it shall be built again with squares and moat, but in a troubled time. 26 And after the sixty-two weeks. an anointed one shall be cut off, and shall have nothing; and the people of the prince who is to come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary. Its end shall come with a flood, and to the end there shall be war; desolations are decreed. 27 And he shall make a strong covenant with many for one week; and for half of the week he shall cause sacrifice and offering to cease; and upon the wing of abominations shall come one who makes desolate, until the decreed end is poured out on the desolator."

- In the Fullness of Time.... the **LONGING** of the people was satisfied
 - Galatians 4:4–5 (RSVCE) 4 But when the time had fully come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, 5 to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons.
 - Thanks to Daniel's (7 & 9) prophecy... expectation for the coming Messiah had reached a fever pitch...
- In the "cool of the day" while in serving in the Temple in Jerusalem...
 - Zachariah entered into the Temple
 - Offered prayers & sacrifice for the sins of the people of God
 - At the hour of incense 3 pm one of the Burning one's ... the Archangel Gabriel came to proclaim a WORD from God for the coming redeemer of the people of God.
 - o The "forerunner" has finally come...
 - Malachi 3:1 (RSVCE) 1 "Behold, I send my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant in whom you delight, behold, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts.
 - Malachi 4:5–6 (RSVCE) 5 "Behold, I will send you <u>Elijah</u> the prophet before the great and terrible day of the Lord comes. 6 And he will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the land with a curse."
- A NEW Virgin was promised... one from David's line...
 - Isaiah 7:14 (RSVCE) 14 Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, a young woman (a VIRGIN) shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanu-el.
 - A young woman... a virgin... betrothed to Joseph of the House of David...
 - Mary knew the promises... meditating on the law and the prophets... holding all in her heart... she EAGERLY awaited the coming of a NEW law... one written on their hearts... a NEW Creation!
 - Jeremiah 31:31–34 (RSVCE) 31 "Behold, the days are coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah, 32 not like the covenant which I made with their fathers when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, my covenant which they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. 33 But this is the covenant which I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it upon their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. 34 And no longer shall each man teach his neighbor and each his

brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

The "Burning One" visits this "Virgin"... to announce the SECOND GOOD NEWS!

■ Luke 1:26–38 (RSVCE) 26 In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, 27 to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. 28 And he came to her and said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" 29 But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and considered in her mind what sort of greeting this might be. 30 And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. 31 And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. 32 He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, 33 and he will reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there will be no end." 34 And Mary said to the angel, "How shall this be, since I have no husband?" 35 And the angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. 36 And behold, your kinswoman Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. 37 For with God nothing will be impossible." 38 And Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her.

- o 40 days Jesus is presented in the Temple
- 490 DAYS....
 - Luke 2:25–35 (RSVCE) 25 Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, looking for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. 26 And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. 27 And inspired by the Spirit he came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of

Along came a snake...

- The great Na-hash is not your garden variety snake
- The most subtle of all creatures... brings a wisdom... a nakedness that is contrary to the nakedness Adam & Eve enjoyed.
- Subtly twisting God's words....
 - **Genesis 3:1–7** (RSVCE) 1 Now the serpent was more subtle than any other wild creature that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God say, 'You shall not eat of any tree of the garden'?" 2 And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden; 3 but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die." 4 But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not die. 5 For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." 6 So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes. and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise. she took of its fruit and ate: and she also gave some to her husband, and he ate. 7 Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves aprons.

Where was Adam?

- Satan was speaking to both... "Ya'll"

 - Day 2 Man of Earth & Man of Heaven.... and the next day... vs. 35
 - Day 3 Fishers of Men gathered on the shore... and the next day... vs. 43
 - Day 4 The SON will open the Heavens... and the next day... Chapter 2 vs. 1
 - Day 7 Sabbath Rest & Wedding Feast!
 - **John 2:1–11** (RSVCE) 1 On the third day there was a marriage at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there; 2 Jesus also was invited to the marriage, with his disciples. 3 When the wine failed, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." 4 And Jesus said to her, "O woman, what have you to do with me? My hour has not yet come." 5 His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." 6 Now six stone jars were standing there, for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. 7 Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. 8 He said to them. "Now draw some out, and take it to the steward of the feast." So they took it. 9 When the steward of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward of the feast called the

 - 1 Corinthians 15:45–49 (RSVCE) 45 Thus it is written, "The first man Adam became a living being"; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. 46 But it is not the spiritual which is first but the physical, and then the spiritual. 47 The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven. 48 As was the man of dust, so are those who are of the dust; and as is the man of heaven, so are those who are of heaven. 49 Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we shall also bear the image of the man of heaven.
 - As the High Priest... in a garden, by a tree... CRIED
 OUT to the one who was able to save him... Heb. 5:1-7
 - Didn't hide at the sound of the hoard come to arrest him & didn't leave the Woman to negotiate for him... John 18:1-9
 - Removed the sword in the garden... opening the way to the Tree of Life in the NEW Garden (Calvary). - John 18:10-11
 - He chose to GIVE UP His flesh to save OUR souls!
 - Mary The NEW Eve -
 - Conceived immaculate free from the stain of sin
 - Betrothed to Joseph
 - FULL of God's Grace
 - She IS the "Full of Grace"
 - Stood by the Tree, in a Garden, and didn't say a single word!
 - Her YES to the Cross...
 - the Fruit of HER womb,,, hung on the Tree of Life,,, becomes the Bread that Christ labored in turmoil, his blood like sweat, falling onto the ground, to bring forth the Holy Eucharist... the food which gives life to all the world!
 - Truly the MOTHER of all the Living!
 - John 19:26–27 (RSVCE) 26 When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" 27 Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And

from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.

CCC 494 - As St. Irenaeus says, "Being obedient she became the cause of salvation for herself and for the whole human race." Hence not a few of the early Fathers gladly assert ...: "The knot of Eve's disobedience was untied by Mary's obedience: what the virgin Eve bound through her disbelief, Mary loosened by her faith."142 Comparing her with Eve, they call Mary "the Mother of the living" and frequently claim: "Death through Eve, life through Mary." (Epiphanius)

repent of their wickedness and believe upon Him.

That the Lord then was manifestly coming to His own things, and was sustaining them by means of that creation which is supported by Himself, and was making a recapitulation of that disobedience which had occurred in connection with a tree, through the obedience which was [exhibited by Himself when He hung] upon a tree, [the effects] also of that deception being done away with, by which that virgin Eve, who was already espoused to a man, was unhappily misled,—was happily announced, through means of the truth [spoken] by the angel to the Virgin Mary, who was [also espoused] to a man. For

just as the former was led astray by the word of an angel, so that she fled from God when she had transgressed His word; so did the latter, by an angelic communication, receive the glad tidings that she should sustain (portaret) God, being obedient to His word. And if the former did disobey God, yet the latter was persuaded to be obedient to God, in order that the Virgin Mary might become the patroness (advocata) of the virgin Eve. And thus, as the human race fell into bondage to death by means of a virgin, so is it rescued by a virgin; virginal disobedience having been balanced in the opposite scale by virginal obedience. For in the same way the sin of the first created man (protoplasti) receives amendment by the correction of the First-begotten, and the coming of the serpent is conquered by the harmlessness of the dove, those bonds being unloosed by which we had been fast bound to death.
